Are zoning and development issues causing controversy in your community? As officials plan for growth, does the public fight it? Are neighboring communities facing the same concerns and challenges?

To manage growth, municipal officials need to balance the needs of the community and the realities of issues such as economic development, agriculture preservation, open space conservation and sprawl. Using your comprehensive plan to take the next step toward your community's goals requires an understanding of the land use tools available and how to make them work. Often, community support is lacking because information is unclear.

This seminar is designed to explain the ins and outs of several land use tools and provide perspectives on a few successful strategies. You will learn why they have been successful and how your community might be able to make them work. Not every tool works for every community — not every community will work with every tool.

Instructors are Local Government Policy Specialists with the Governor's Center for Local Government Services with extensive experience as local government officials themselves.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

Elected and appointed municipal officials and administrators and planning commission members from municipalities with a comprehensive plan, a planning commission, a subdivision and land development ordinance, and/or zoning ordinance, active local citizens and Environmental Advisory Council members. This course is designed for officials who have at least a basic understanding of these common land use tools.
